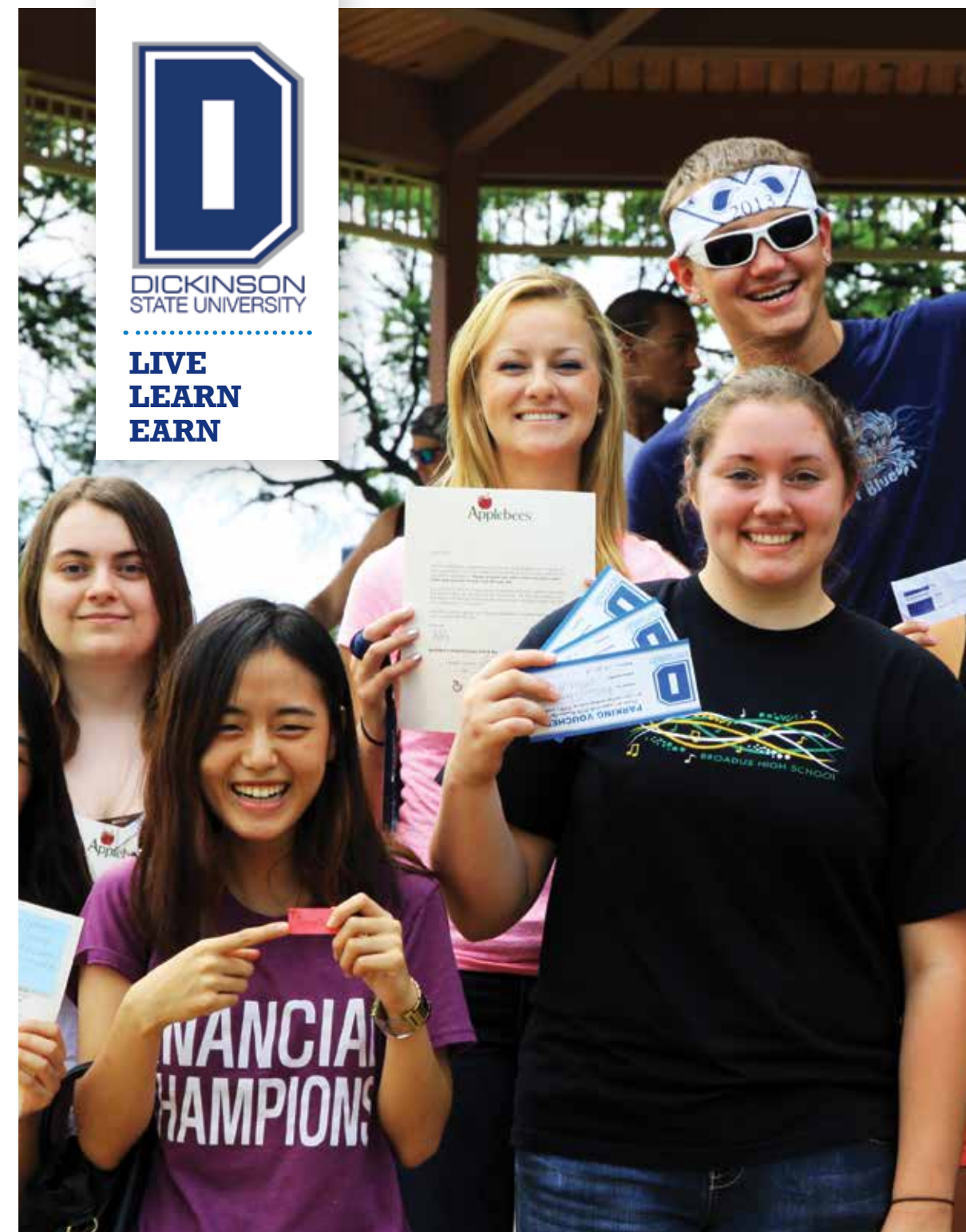

Dickinson encourages students to choose an academic program that excites them—that's why we offer more than 50 fields of study. In addition to classes, students undertake internships that coincide with their majors and engage in student

research that lets them dig deeper into the topics that interest them. In fact, many students choose to showcase original work—including scientific research, literature reviews, humanities papers, creative writing, and musical or dramatic performances—at the annual **Celebration of Scholars**.

Here are just a few academic highlights:

- The College-to-Professional Accounting Experience simulates a professional office environment that challenges students to solve problems rather than just follow processes.
- The Praxis pass rate for teacher education candidates is consistently higher than 90 percent.
- DSU's student literary arts publication, *Impressions*, allows you to publish creative work.
- DSU is one of the only schools in the region to offer a minor in coaching.
- In 2013, the cohort pass rate for both the AASPN and BSN programs was 92 percent.
- The Theodore Roosevelt Honors Leadership Program combines elements of leadership, service, and academic rigor into the curriculum through special honors courses.

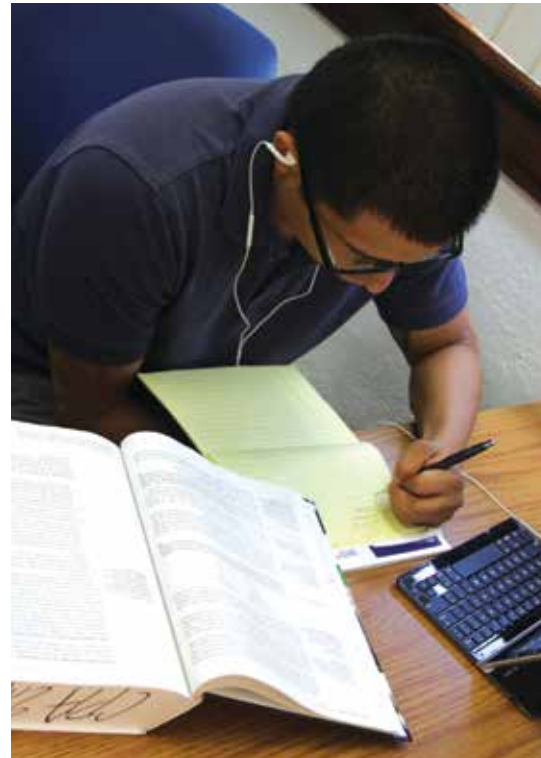
