There are many reasons to consider a transfer to Dickson State. Perhaps you attended a two-year campus and are now ready to complete your four-year degree. Maybe you are transferring because you are interested in a specific major or in opportunities to participate in athletics or fine arts, or maybe you are transferring for personal reasons. Whatever your reason, we want to help make your transfer experience a positive one. Here are some tips to help you be successful as you transfer to DSU.

····· Use Your Campus

Dickinson State University recognizes that as a transfer student you require different orientation needs than incoming freshmen. That's why we offer programs designed to make all incoming students feel right at home. As a transfer student, you will work with enrollment coaches to help you through the technical parts of the transfer process. Your transcripts will be evaluated, and you will work with a content area advisor at an advising and registration session to make sure you are on the right path to completing your degree. Once you are here, you will have resources for success, including content and transfer advisors, the Academic Success Center, Tutoring Center, the Career Development Center, and the Alumni Foundation. Become familiar with the resources available to you—utilize these resources and ask questions.

Take Advantage of Advising and Career Development Tools

Academic planning is crucial for your success as a transfer student. As a transfer student at DSU, you will have two advisors to assist you—your content area advisor and a transfer student advisor. These advisors are here to help you access the resources you need for success in and out of the classroom. Your content area advisor is available to help you understand your degree audit—what courses have transferred to DSU and what you still need to take. Your transfer student advisor can help you learn about your online account and registration, as well as provide direction regarding financial aid, satisfactory academic progress, and resources for academic support.

The Career Development Center is also a great resource for you. In the Career Development Center, you can explore your career interests and the Career Ladder Program—partnerships between DSU and local business that give students career opportunities and a chance to blend classroom education with business experience. The staff in the Career Development Center will also assist you with résumé writing, interview skills, and networking opportunities. 
Get Involved


Track Your TRansfer

We are looking forward to welcoming you to DSU. Now that you have decided to transfer, what comes next? Keep this checklist handy during the transfer process to ensure you're on the right track.



Months Prior to Transfer

- SUBMIT YOUR ADMISSION APPLICATION to Dickinson State University. Be sure to have the transcripts
 from your current institution sent. You will need to send official transcripts when you apply and send
 updated official transcripts once you finish your final semester at your current school.
- SCHEDULE A CAMPUS VISIT. The admissions staff will help schedule your visit, which may include: a tour
 of campus and campus housing; a visit with a content area advisor in your major; and campus events such
 as athletic competitions, theater productions, dance, and concert performances. Share your interests with
 us, and we will personalize a campus visit for you.
- APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID. At Dickinson State University you have two avenues for financial aid: federal
 and institutional.
 - » For federal aid, you need to submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov to determine whether you qualify for federal and state grants, work-study programs, or loans. Note: If you are transferring midyear, you can go online and amend your current FAFSA to add DSU 's school code 002989.
 - » For institutional aid, you can apply through the DSU foundation online. You will need to have your DSU student ID number in order to complete the application for scholarships. Ask your DSU enrollment coach for your ID number and apply by December 15 annually.





Months Prior to Transfer

- CONTACT THE HOUSING OFFICE to explore all of your living arrangement options. Students who have completed fewer than 60 credit hours are required to live in DSU campus housing.
- SUBMIT ALL FINAL ADMISSIONS DOCUMENTS and register for a SOAR advising and registration session.
- After you have met with your advisor and have your schedule, TAKE A SELF-GUIDED TOUR of campus to locate where your classes will meet.

admissions Requirements

Admissions Requirements

To be considered as transfer status at DSU, students must have completed 24 or more semester hours (36 or more quarter hours) of credit toward a degree and remain in good standing at their most recent institution attended.

Transfer students must meet the admissions requirements for the semester and academic year they are admitted. Current admission requirements and deadlines are available online at: www.dickinsonstate.edu/future_students/howtoapply.

FOR CONSIDERATION, ALL APPLICANTS MUST SUBMIT:

- A completed application and \$35 nonrefundable application fee
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended. (You must request official transcripts from all schools—even if you don't like the grades you received or you did not complete the courses.)
- · Copy of immunization record (showing proof of MMRs 1 & 2)

Applicants who have completed fewer than 24 semester hours must also submit:

- ACT or SAT scores
- · High school transcript in an officially sealed envelope
- College Preparatory Course Report Form (CORE)


