

DSU Hazing Report Form

Reporting Requirement

Hazing is a violation of state law and University policy and is strictly prohibited by Dickinson State University both on and off campus, at University sponsored or approved activities as well as non-University activities.

Dickinson State University expects all members of the University community who believe that they have witnessed, experienced, or are aware of conduct that constitutes Hazing, to report the conduct directly to DSU Campus Safety at 701.290.1068 or by using the online Hazing Report Form. The Hazing Report Form allows for both anonymous and personally identifiable reports. This report must be filed with the DSU Campus Safety Office, Email: dsu.publicsafety@dickinsonstate.edu

If anyone is experiencing harm or is in imminent danger, please call **911**. In addition, Hazing, both on and off campus, may be reported to the Dickinson Police Department at [701-456-7759](tel:701-456-7759).

A **mandatory reporter** (Campus Security Authority) must immediately report any information about past, current, or planned hazing to the DSU Campus Safety Office at 701.290.1068 or by using the online Hazing Report Form. A mandatory reporter's obligation to report is not fulfilled with an anonymous report.

State Law

NDCC Section 12.1-17-10 - Hazing - Penalty

organization, the person willfully engages in conduct that creates a substantial risk of physical injury to that other person or a third person. As used in this section, "conduct" means any treatment or forced physical activity that is likely to adversely affect the physical health or safety of that other person or a third person, or which subjects that other person or third person to extreme mental stress, and may include extended deprivation of sleep or rest or extended isolation, whipping, beating, branding, forced calisthenics, overexposure to the weather, and forced consumption of any food, liquor, beverage, drug, or other substance. **The offense is a class A misdemeanor if the actor's conduct causes physical injury, otherwise the offense is a class B misdemeanor.**

Definitions

“Hazing” is any intentional, knowing, or reckless act committed by a person (whether individually or in concert with other persons) against another person or persons regardless of the willingness of such other person or persons to participate, that is committed in the course of an initiation into, an affiliation with, or the maintenance of membership in, a student organization; and causes or creates a risk, above the reasonable risk encountered in the course of participation in the institution of higher education or the organization (such as the physical preparation necessary for participation in an athletic team), of physical or psychological injury including whipping, beating, striking, electronic shocking, placing of a harmful substance on someone's body, or similar activity; causing, coercing, or otherwise inducing sleep deprivation, exposure to the elements, confinement in a small space, extreme calisthenics, or other similar activity; causing, coercing, or otherwise inducing another person to consume food, liquid, alcohol, drugs, or other substances; causing, coercing, or otherwise inducing another person to perform sexual acts; any activity that places another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words or conduct; any activity against another person that includes a criminal violation of local, State, Tribal, or Federal law; and any activity that induces, causes, or

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requires another person to perform a duty or task that involves a criminal violation of local, State, Tribal, or Federal law.”.

“Student organization” is an organization at an institution of higher education (such as a club, society, association, varsity or junior varsity athletic team, club sports team, fraternity, sorority, band, or student government) in which two or more of the members are students enrolled at the institution of higher education, whether or not the organization is established or recognized by the institution.

You may submit a report anonymously. Only the fields with an asterisk are required. Please understand that this may limit the extent to which the University is able to address the issue. We ask reporters to submit as much detail as possible including documents, email, photographs, and videos.

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This form should be used to report acts of hazing that may violate the DSU Hazing policy and/or North Dakota state law.
